Language of politics in time of conflict

This paper provides an overview of the elements of political discourse. It deals with the relationship between language and power, with the concept of political discourse and with the main features of political speeches. The theoretical framework for the analysis is situated within Critical Discourse Analysis (CDA). Attention is also paid to the function of persuasion in discourse. The paper aims to observe the main features of the "war on terror" discourse as well as discursive strategies through which justification of important political decisions can be achieved. The main focus of the second part of the article is placed on the concept of metaphor in political discourse, more specifically in the Cold War political discourse. Emphasis is also placed on the persuasive function of metaphors in political discourse.
